Working in a fully-equipped training salon at Te Pūkenga NMIT you will learn to:

- Develop a range of elementary hairstyling skills, including presenting fashion competition work
- Develop skills to support a stylist within the salon
- Provide service and care to clients in a salon
- Understand and document a client's journey within the salon environment
- Understand fashion trends to be able to present a personal fashion image

This is a practical introduction to a career that never goes out of fashion!

During this programme you will work toward credits in the NZ Certificate in Salon Services Level 2.



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On completion of this course you will be able to:

- Demonstrate knowledge of the client journey in a salon.
- Present a personal fashion image for work in a hairdressing salon environment.
- Prepare and protect the client for hairdressing services.
- Identify a salon operator's resource requirements for the day; and maintain the operator's schedule or work and resources throughout the day.
- Maintain the cleanliness, the tidiness of reception and client areas, the level of supplies, and the laundry for a salon.
- Give information to clients and respond to enquiries in a specified workplace.
