

Curriculum Goals:

The Level 3 Adventure Tourism Leadership programme builds on participants' existing outdoor skills, allowing them to become more confident and skilled in different outdoor environments. The programme will focus on developing participants' leadership skills whilst engaging in challenging learning opportunities. During the programme students will prepare for, participate in and evaluate multiple outdoor expeditions, whilst also sharpening their bush survival skills and learning more about navigation in the outdoors and weather patterns.

This programme includes both practical and written assessments. Underpinning the curriculum is the development of crucial personal and social development skills transferable to any vocational pathway.

Entry Requirements:

This course requires students to operate in the outdoors at a high level and to be more independent in their approach to learning. It is therefore recommended that students can demonstrate the following:

- Completion of Adventure Tourism Leadership Level 2 or Uniformed Services Level 2 or equivalent (with a teacher recommendation)
- An ability to self-manage; and
- A high level of interest in the outdoors

Programme Delivery:

This course is delivered by Whenua Iti Outdoors in a residential block format. There are four blocks in total; with each block being 4 days/3 nights (Monday – Thursday). Each block will have a specific expedition format.

Students will stay at different locations for each block, depending on the selected activity. This may include staying on site at Whenua Iti or in local campgrounds, huts and local wilderness areas.
