

Curriculum Goals:

The Emergency Response (Tahi) programme provides students with a broad base of technical and practical first aid and emergency response skills. Students will have the opportunity to experience a simulated search and rescue exercise and gain essential first aid skills. In addition, students will have the opportunity to gain unit standards and credits that count towards a student's NCEA Record of Achievement. Underpinning the programme is the development of crucial personal and social development skills transferable to any vocational pathway.

Programme Delivery:

This course is delivered in a residential block format, with two blocks in total. Each block will focus on a specific curriculum area and is four days in length (Monday – Thursday).

Week 1: First Aid

Week 2: Emergency Response

Personal and Social Development Objectives:

- Increasing willingness to learn
- Understanding and assuming personal responsibility
- Developing belief in self and increasing confidence
- Developing a positive attitude
- Recognising and developing potential
- Developing resilience skills (coping with challenge and change)
- Developing positive communication skills

Learning Objectives:

- Provide basic life support
- Provide first aid
- Manage first aid in an emergency situation
- Use general purpose knots and lines in an emergency situation
- Demonstrate knowledge of the role and functions of Civil Defence general rescue at ground level
- Identify safety equipment, safety precautions and hazards in general rescue situations at ground level
- Plan and carry out searches to locate simulated casualties within specified area at ground level
- Move casualties to safe locations
