

Beauty Salon Skills 2018 Course Outline

Curriculum Goals:

To provide students with the opportunity to experience working in the field of beauty salon services to assist them in making an informed decision for further study and/or employment. This course is practical and experiential. Students have given the opportunity to develop and practice basic beauty and body therapy skills and techniques in the NMIT purpose-built beauty salon.

All unit standards contribute towards the New Zealand Certificate in Salon Skills (Introductory) Level 2.

Vocational Pathway: Service Industries

Learner Goals and Outcomes: On completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Demonstrate knowledge of the client journey in a salon.
2. Provide client service and care and assist the operator to prepare for service in a beauty salon environment.
3. Describe key concepts related to personal presentation and maintain personal presentation for a commercial beauty salon.
4. Demonstrate knowledge of current fashion trends for a beauty therapy service, by:
 - a. Identifying sources of relevant fashion trend information.
 - b. Identifying and illustrating relevant fashion trends.
 - c. Explaining and analysing trends in terms of their influence on beauty therapy.
5. Demonstrate knowledge of the history of beauty therapy services and related products by describing significant historical milestones in the history of beauty services and products.
6. Describe the relevance of anatomy and physiology knowledge to beauty therapy practice.
7. Provide information and respond to enquiries within a salon environment.
