

Curriculum Goals:

The Manaaki Tāpoi Introduction course aims to celebrate the importance of cultural (indigenous) tourism. Learning will focus on key elements of the Māori culture and how they are interpreted in cultural tourism experiences. Students will gain an appreciation for the high regard that the Māori culture is held in by overseas visitors and will have opportunity to interact with these visitors.

Programme Delivery:

This course is delivered by Whenua Iti Outdoors in a residential block format. There are four blocks in total, each block is four days in length. Students will stay at a different marae for each block.

- Clear wharakai after service, as part of team, in accordance with kawa and tikanga.
- Explain the importance of Māori place names in tourism.
- List and use a range of te reo greetings and farewells in tourism.
