

Curriculum Goals:

The Manaaki Tāpoi Level 3 (Advanced) programme will strengthen participants' understanding both of the uniqueness of Māori culture as well as the interconnectedness of Te Ao Māori. The course builds on the Manaaki Tāpoi Level 2 (Introduction) programme to develop further skills and ability to interact with manuhiri through the delivery of Māori tourism experiences.

Entry Requirements:

It is strongly recommended that students can demonstrate the following outcomes prior to course start:

- Be able to present their own pepeha
- Have a sound knowledge of whanaungatanga
- Have a sound knowledge of kaitiakitanga
- Be able to recite at least one karakia from memory
- Be able to recite at least one waiata from memory

Programme Delivery:

This course is delivered by Whenua Iti Outdoors in a residential block format. There are four blocks in total, each block is four days in length.
