



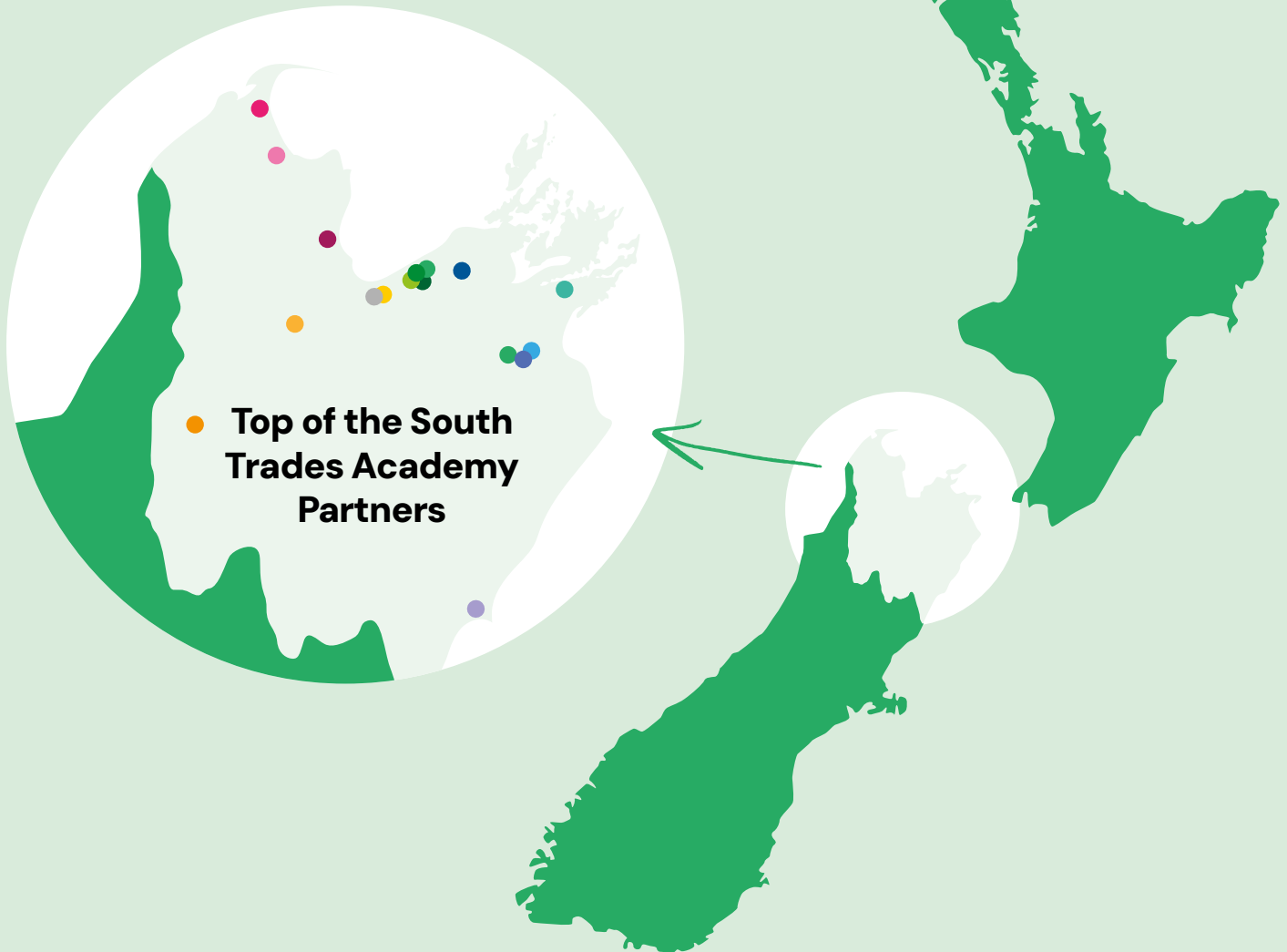

The Top of the South Trades Academy is opening doors for students like you, who want to stay at school but are ready to start training for a real job.

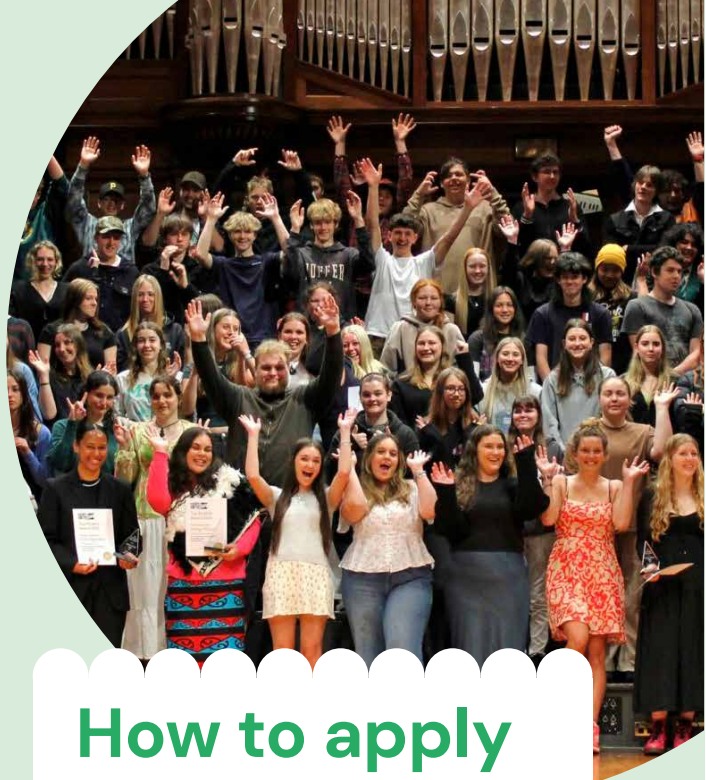

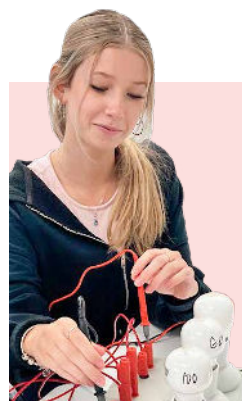

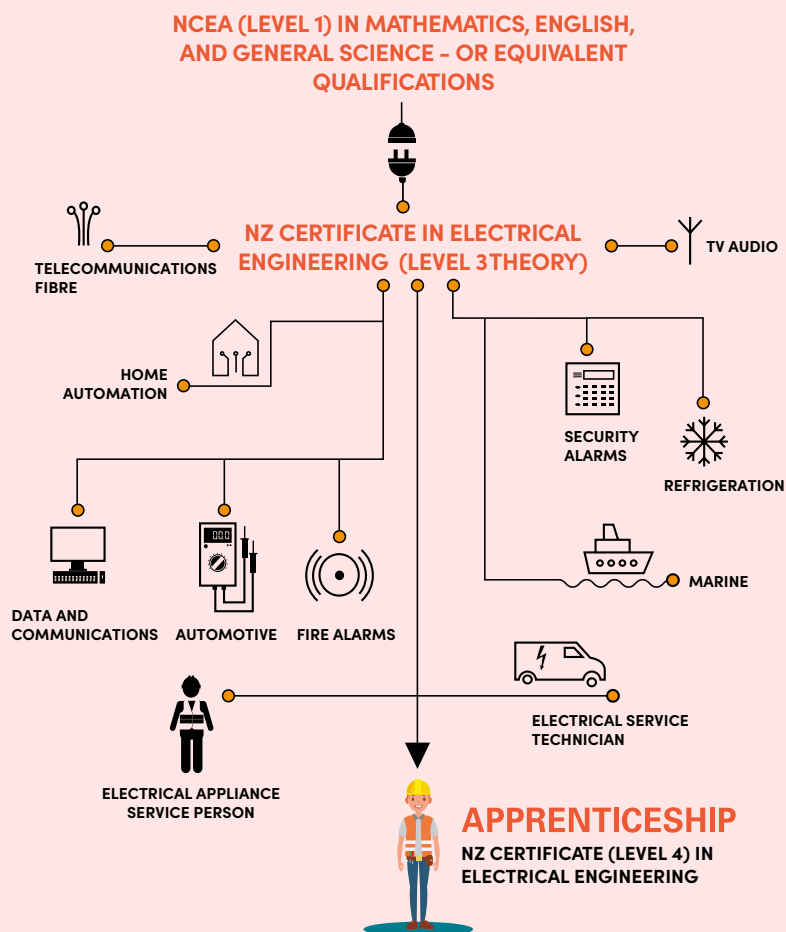

(Mechanical and Aeronautical)



If you are interested in mechanics, engines and aviation, and relish in a technical challenge, then join us at the NMIT Woodbourne Campus at The Royal New Zealand Air Force (RNZAF) Base.

In this hands-on course, you'll get to work in both the mechanical and aviation workshops, learning how to machine, weld and fabricate with metal. You'll be building projects such as rocket stoves and fire pits, using CAD/CAM software to create 3D printed models, and learning about the principles of aircraft flight. Get amongst real aircraft and cutting-edge technology and gain invaluable insights into the exciting realm of Aviation Engineering—a profession in high demand and ripe with opportunity.

You will take field trips to local Aviation points of interest throughout the year and connect with NMIT's industry partners such as AirNZ, Rocket Lab and AirForce recruiters.

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Mechanical Engineering



If you like making and fixing things and enjoy working with your hands, then chances are you'll make a great mechanical engineer.

This programme will see you working in NMIT's Mechanical Engineering workshops learning how to machine, weld and fabricate with metal.

You will explore different facets of mechanical engineering and build projects like rocket stoves, fire pits, engineering tools, garden art or even create your own project.

You will use CAD/CAM software used in the industry

to produce engineering drawings and output to our 3D printers to create models and prototypes. You could even progress to manufacture your part on our HAAS CNC machining centre.

This is a very practical, hands-on course so be prepared to get stuck in!

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Environmental Sustainability



If you enjoy being outside, being active and learning in a hands-on, practical way, then come and join our efforts to protect New Zealand's unique biodiversity!

The Level 3 Environmental Sustainability programme will focus on bringing environmental sustainability, conservation practices and mātauranga Māori (Māori knowledge and wisdom) to life through a series of field-based, environmental activities.

The curriculum will be engaging, practical and delivered in a dynamic learning environment. It aims to give students a good background on environmental and conservation issues facing our modern society, with an emphasis placed on creating a positive connection to our natural world



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and therefore a desire to preserve it. Students will be exposed to ways they can reduce their impact and will have the opportunity to interact with groups who are doing some amazing work to preserve and restore our natural world.

Underpinning the curriculum is the development of crucial personal and social development skills transferable to any vocational pathway.

- Explain kaitiakitanga in terms of how Māori interact with te taiao.
- Explain the use of tikanga Māori as part of exercising kaitiakitanga.
- Plan, carry out and evaluate a local kaitiakitanga activity.

Whether you're aiming for a career on or around the water or are passionate about marine life, our course is your gateway to connecting to our moana.

This course will project you to a new level of understanding of our precious marine world. You'll learn about the different marine ecosystems, the animals that live in them and how to grow fish and shellfish in these challenging environments.

No two days will be the same. Some days you'll be on the water in the NMIT boats, others in a lab with a microscope. Discover the challenges our oceans

face and how marine conservation and restorative aquaculture can help.

Practical classes will take you out to see animals in their natural habitats. Learn to understand their biology and their needs to survive and thrive. You'll raise some of these animals in NMIT's world-class aquaculture rearing facilities and see the challenges and successes of growing them in a hatchery environment onsite at NMIT.

Studying in Nelson is the perfect training ground. Te Taihu, Top of the South Island, is home to over 400 blue economy businesses, which represent more than 30% of New Zealand's economic activity in fishing, aquaculture, and seafood processing. 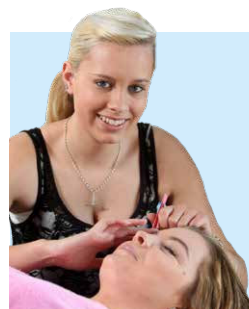

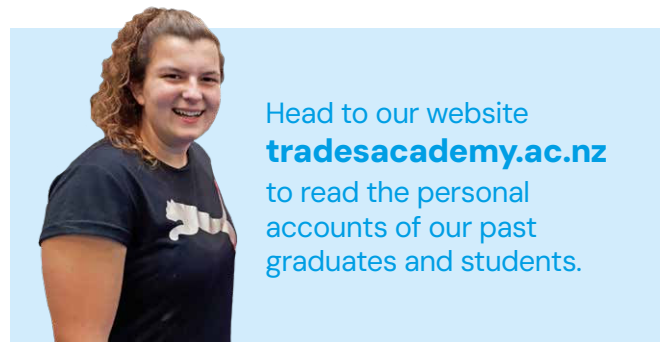

→ Kaitiaki Leadership Level 3:

The Kaitiaki Leadership Programme will build adventure skills and conservation knowledge, from both Western and te āo Māori perspectives, across 9 days of multi-activity expeditions. A focus of this programme will be on conservation and kaitiakitanga, including predator trapping and control. Activities will include the opportunity to contribute to existing conservation projects which allow students to develop an understanding of environmental management practices and the technical and personal skills required to effectively participate in field-based environmental programmes. Students will explore the wilderness of Te Taihu – Top of the South Island, a perfect platform to build up conservation awareness and an understanding of kaitiakitanga principles in environmental management of these sites.*

Students will have the opportunity to complete 13 credits at Level 3.

As these courses require students to operate in the outdoors at a high level, it is recommended that students are reasonably independent in their approach to learning, have an ability to self-manage and have a high level of interest in the outdoors and conservation.

Manaaki Tāpoi explores and celebrates the importance of Cultural Tourism within NZ and builds a deeper understanding of Te Āo Māori.

Take a journey through the cultural history of Te Tau Ihu o Te Waka a Maui (the Top of the South). Learn from expert tutors and kaumatua, visit and stay on marae across the region and interact with Māori business leaders of the region.

This programme is designed to be experiential and active whilst embedding and reinforcing pride in Aotearoa's cultural heritage. You will learn the importance of strong connections to Te Ao Māori and the value these connections can bring to a wide range of career paths.

Manaaki Tāpoi (Introduction) at Level 2 focuses on whanaungatanga, kaitiakitanga, serving of kai and te reo greetings and farewells used in tourism. On completion of Manaaki Tāpoi (Introduction), students can pathway

onto the Manaaki Tāpoi (Advanced) programme at Level 3. This course focuses on kaitiaki practices in Māori Tourism and the history of natural attractions and significant sites in our region.

Students who complete Manaaki Tāpoi Level 2 or Level 3 may be invited to enrol in the Manaaki Tāpoi Level 3 Extension programme. This programme builds on previous skills and experience. Taura will interpret aspects of their culture and model tikanga whilst participating in noho marae and in workplace and school settings. Learning will focus on the effective and appropriate interpretation of key elements of the Māori culture through the facilitation and delivery of workshops.
