

# Manaaki Tāpoi Extension – Level 3

## Course Outline

### Curriculum Goals:

The Manaaki Tāpoi Extension course aims to build on skills and knowledge developed on the Level 2 and Level 3 courses. Taura will be required to interpret aspects of their culture and model aspects of tikanga both whilst participating in a noho marae and in a workplace setting. Learning will focus on the effective and appropriate interpretation of key elements of the Māori culture within a workplace setting. Students will gain an appreciation for the high regard that the Māori culture is held in by overseas visitors and will have opportunity to interact with these visitors.

### Programme Delivery:

This course is delivered by Whenua Iti Outdoors in a residential block format. There are four blocks in total, each block is four days in length. Students will stay at a different marae for each block.

### Learner Goals and Outcomes:

On completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Participate in a noho marae.
- Apply marae tikanga in the workplace.
- Communicate in the workplace using a vocabulary of conversational words and phrases in te reo Māori.
- Communicate in the workplace using greetings and farewells in te reo Māori.
- Demonstrate knowledge of, and use waiata when communicating in the workplace.
- Demonstrate knowledge of Māori associates with connections to the workplace.
- Explain tikanga in relation to communicating with Māori associates.
- Demonstrate knowledge of communication with people from other cultures.
- Communicate with people from other cultures.
- Contribute within a team or group which has an objective.
