

Uniformed Services (Level 2) Course Outline

Curriculum Goals:

To provide students with the opportunity to explore career pathways within a range of uniformed services, these include Search and Rescue Services, Emergency Services, and Civil Defence Services. You will have the opportunity to experience a simulated search and rescue exercise and gain essential first aid skills. You will hear first-hand what it is really like to be a paramedic, a police officer and a firefighter.

Programme Delivery:

This course is delivered in a residential block format, with four blocks in total. Each block represents one of the four uniformed services curriculum areas and is four days in length. Students will take part in a range of practical activities and will be given the opportunity to learn through engaging in realistic and authentic tasks.

- Demonstrate bush survival skills
- Communicate in a team or group which has an objective
- Contribute within a team or group which has an objective
- Explain search and rescue procedures
- Recognise a Civil Defence emergency
- Prepare for survival during a Civil Defence emergency
- Communicate in the outdoors using two-way radio
- Manage first aid in an emergency situation
- Provide first aid
- Provide basic life support
- Explain long-term management requirements for an emergency care situation in an outdoor recreation environment
- Assess and manage a patient's condition long-term in an outdoor recreation environment
