

Mechanica Engineering



If you're into making and fixing things and like working with your hands, then chances are you'll make a really good mechanical engineer. This challenging programme will see you working in NMIT's Mechanical Engineering workshops learning how to machine, weld and fabricate with metal.

During the year you'll design, build and race either a grass kart or an electric vehicle (EVolocity option) with your team-mates. Training is pretty much hands-on, so be prepared to get stuck in.

The two mechanical options offered both have the same welding components (unit standards), but the **EVolocity** option promotes sustainability, electric vehicle updates and careers in engineering (mechanical, electrical, electronics, programming and CAD).

In the Mechanical Engineering option you will build a traditional Grass Kart, whereas the focus of the EVolocity course will be on challenging you to build an electric bike/scooter/cart which you will then use to compete with at the end of the year at the EVolocity competition.



The facilities here at NMIT are really big, with heaps of equipment.

Environmental



If you're interested in the environment and the world around you, but would rather be in the outdoors than in the classroom, then this is the programme for you.

The Level 3 Environmental Science programme is designed to bring science to life through a series of field-based, environmental investigations. The programme focus is on developing an understanding of environmental science, environmental management and traditional Māori environmental management practices. Students will carry out practical activities and investigations at sites throughout the top of the south.

Students will have the opportunity to investigate the ecological niches of local animals and plants, as well as exploring the habitats of native freshwater and marine fish and shellfish.

The programme focus is on developing an understanding of environmental management practices and the technical and personal skills required to effectively participate in field-based environmental management programmes. Learning will be active, students will need to be physically fit and prepared for practical work in remote environments.

World of Wine Cellar Operations



Take the first step into the exciting world of viticulture and cellar operations in this Marlborough based programme. Gain industry recognised skills and experience to take into industry employment or further tertiary study.

In this diverse 2 year programme students will work towards completing a Level 3 NZ Certificate in Cellar Operations. In the first year you'll explore both the local and international wine industry, including sustainable wine tourism, cellar door and restaurant operations and wine industry logistics. In the second year you will be introduced to red and white winemaking processes and skills to enable you to work effectively in a wine cellar team.

Learn about the history, geography and climate of the main grape growing areas of the world and how these influence wine style.

You'll also learn about vineyard technology, including how to use specialised equipment such as drones, water monitoring technology and laser guided tractors. In cellar operations you'll get to experience the basic workings of a cellar environment and the different equipment used.

This practical introduction to the industry will see you working in NMIT's state-of-the-art kitchen and restaurant training facility where you'll be preparing, cooking and serving some of our region's finest produce.

The Hospitality programme is available at both Level 2 (Hospitality) and Level 3 (Culinary Arts). The focus of the first year is on developing knowledge and skills in various areas of hospitality, including cooking, café service, introductory barista (coffeemaking) and front-of house. Students in the Year 2 Culinary Arts programme, have the opportunity to further develop their cooking skills in the commercial kitchen; learning how to put together ingredients and flavours to come up with mouthwatering local and international dishes.



Manaak

Manaaki Tāpoi explores and celebrates the importance of Cultural Tourism within NZ and builds a deeper understanding of Te Āo Māori.



Take a journey through the cultural history of Te Tau Ihu o Te Waka a Maui (the Top of the South). Learn from expert tutors and kaumatua, visit and stay on marae across the region and interact with Māori business leaders of the region.

This programme is designed to be experiential and active whilst embedding and reinforcing pride in Aotearoa's cultural heritage. You will learn the importance of strong connections to Te Ao Māori and the value these connections can bring to a wide range of career paths.

Manaaki Tāpoi (Introduction) at Level 2 focuses on whanaungatanga, kaitiakitanga, serving of kai and te reo greetings and farewells used in tourism. On completion of Manaaki Tāpoi (Introduction), students can pathway onto the Manaaki Tāpoi (Advanced) programme at Level 3. This course focuses on kaitiaki practices in Māori Tourism and the history of natural attractions and significant sites in our region.
